



### ABOUT

Catholic Charities Youth Club at St. Francis of Assisi offers summer and after-school educational programs for third to fifth grade youth living in East Palo Alto. Low-cost tutoring, physical fitness, and technology and environmental education services provide a safe haven of learning and growth.

Through dedicated homework time and tutoring, the Youth Club improves language, literacy, math and science skills in order to close the educational achievement gap between high achieving students and those who are falling behind. Youth Club children grow into healthy and self-sufficient adults who positively contribute in their community and the world.

### SERVICES

- After-school programming, including homework support, individual tutoring, and nutritious snacks
- Enrichment activities, including art, physical fitness, reading, science and community field trips
- Staff from the community to provide role models and mentoring
- Parent education and family support program
- Counseling, information, and referral to local agencies
- Partnerships with local organizations including Ravenswood School District, Sponsor Employment Program, Community Access Ticket Services, One East Palo Alto, Sacred Heart Preparatory, Stanford Haas Center, College Track and Belle Haven Pool

### CHANGE MODEL

#### The Need

Children living in low-income non-English speaking households in East Palo Alto are facing:

- An education gap in English and math
- Little to no exposure to role models and experiences that provide guidance for behavior
- A negative learning environment outside school

#### Our Response

- Trained staff and volunteers
- Homework and tutoring
- Enrichment activities outside of the community
- Regular exercise
- A safe and healthy space

#### Client Outcomes

- Improved school performance in English, math, and citizenship
- Improved homework completion

#### Community Impact

- Public schools experience better prepared students
- Reduction in generational poverty
- Increased community leaders
- Increased educational equity for marginalized communities
