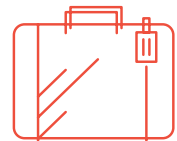

ABOUT

Catholic Charities Boys' & Girls' Homes provide residential treatment, mental health, and community and school-based services to adjudicated youth ages 12-18, most of whom are transitioning from a juvenile hall setting or an out-of-state placement. A combination of therapeutic, educational, rehabilitation, and recreational programs address the multiple and diverse needs of each child. The youth live in two San Francisco residences, which are staffed 24 hours a day.

The Boys' & Girls' Homes serve as a diversion program for at-risk and in-risk youth of San Francisco that encourages healthy habits and relationships and productive re-entry into society. This program is dedicated to focusing on achieving personal stability for each client and working on restoring a healthy and successful relationship between the client, their family, and the community.
