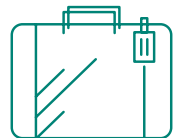

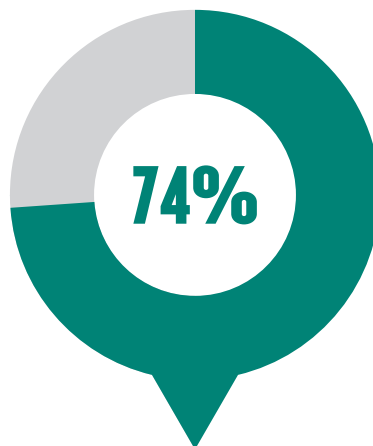

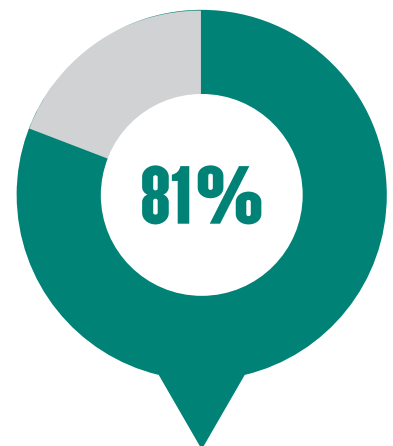
These results are based on the self-sufficiency matrix assessment tool completed for the head of household.

## ABOUT

Catholic Charities Peter Claver Community provides permanent housing and comprehensive nursing and social work case management support services to formerly homeless San Francisco clients who are very low income, who are living with disabling HIV/AIDS, and with co-occurring major psychiatric and/or substance abuse disorders. Opened in 1985, the program marked one of the earliest attempts by any organization to aggressively serve those sick and dying from HIV/AIDS.

To minimize the utilization of hospital emergency rooms, crisis services, and other publicly-funded health systems, the staff is able to address most problems on-site. Registered Nurses, Certified Nursing Assistants, a Licensed Marriage Family Therapist, and a Social Work Case Manager assist clients in increasing adherence to complex medical regimes, avert acute medical/psychiatric hospitalizations and facilitate care coordination among multiple health providers.

## SERVICES

- Nursing care and Certified Nursing Assistant supervision 24/7
- On-site social work case management and medication management
- Coordination of care with medical and other ancillary providers, including substance abuse and recovery services
- Transportation to appointments
- Mental health and support group services
- Hospice Care
- Customized menus and three meals provided daily
- Collaboration with the other HIV service providers to ensure that residents have all their medical, psychosocial and spiritual needs met
